1. Educational & Professional Eligibility

- LLB degree (3 or 5 years) from a recognized university
- Enrolled with a State Bar Council and possess a Certificate of Practice
- As per Supreme Court (May 2025), minimum 3 years of legal practice is required

- Standard Requirements: LLB, enrollment, 3 years of practice
